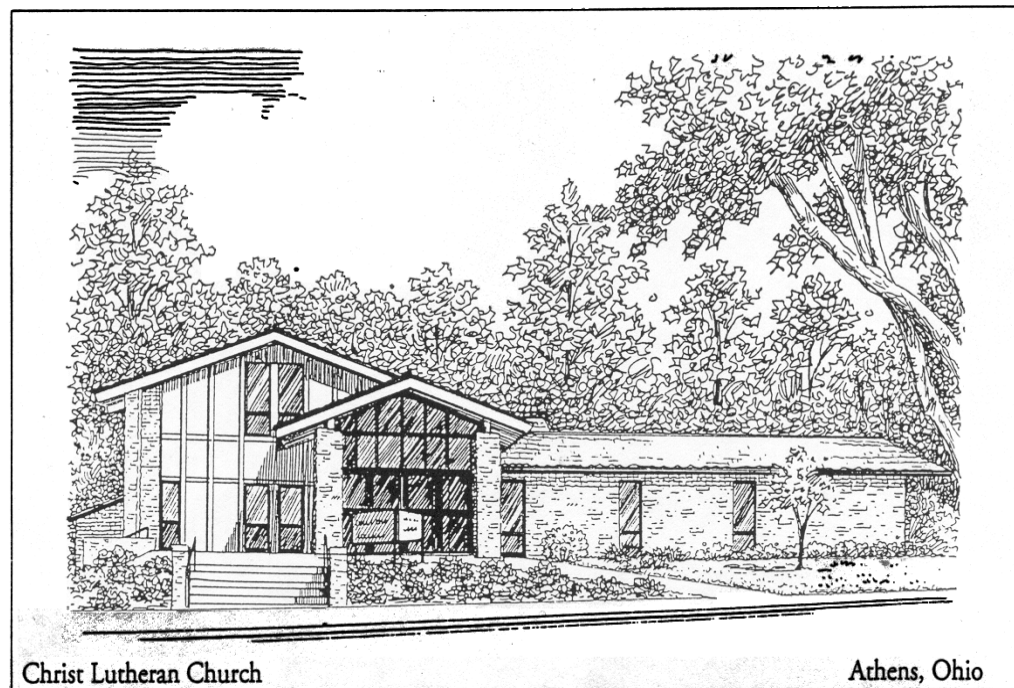

## *“From Your Pastor”*

Welcome to Lent. Lent is a tradition of the ancient Christian church to reflect on the suffering and sacrifice of Jesus for a forty day period prior to the celebration of Christ's resurrection on Easter. If you count the days on a calendar you will find that Sundays are not included in the forty days. They are “little Easters” interspersed in the season to remind us of the light that still shines through the darkness that cannot be overcome. The old, old tradition of Lent has long been established around the theme of “Giving Something Up for Lent”. This has been thought of as a small sacrifice to remind us of the ultimate sacrifice made by Jesus. Many folks have used this discipline as a way to try to rid themselves of some burden that has weighed them down for some time. Sometimes folks just give up something they really enjoy for this period of time. Over the centuries, some people have used this opportunity to ‘give up’ some pleasure, some habit, or some vice in their lives. People have “given up” all sorts of things. They give up chocolate, or sweets, TV, or computer gaming, smoking, alcohol, red meat, or donuts! Sometimes they take up an exercise program, or some other positive activity or service to others. The point is, what you “give up” is something YOU choose (from the youngest to the oldest of us). This reminds us of the radical free choice Jesus made to carry all the brokenness of creation, through no fault of His own. Part of the point of it all, the commitment behind the discipline is that we choose it for ourselves. Predictably though, pastors are often turned to for help in the process of discernment of what to “give up”. So, as your Sabbatical Pastor, here's my suggestion: Don't DO anything. Just BE. There are three scriptural themes I would direct you to.

### Food Pantry Update

For 2009 the Athens County Food Pantry served 8,852 people, or approximately 20% more than the previous year. Rough calculations show that we distributed approximately 92,000 pounds of food and more than 20% was given by the churches and local community. We are very appreciative of this generous show of support.

As we start the new year, our shelves are quite empty, partly because there was less food available from the Foodbank in Logan, and partly because we had to use up the inventory we had on hand. A continuing challenge for the Pantry is providing high protein, nutritious food at a reasonable cost. This year, with the addition of a freezer at our distribution center, we hope to take advantage of frozen food available from the Foodbank and other sources.

Christ Lutheran Church collects canned goods and monetary donations for the Food Pantry on the first Sunday of every month. Thank you for your past donations and your continued support this year!

First, God commands His children to REMEMBER THE SABBATH AND KEEP IT HOLY. Be in church during Lent. Second, God urges us to BE STILL AND KNOW THAT I AM. Thirdly, remember that Jesus promised that WHENEVER TWO OR THREE OF YOU ARE GATHERED IN MY NAME, I WILL BE THERE ALSO. Trust that Jesus will be there with you in the stillness. These themes illustrate what I am suggesting. Just take fifteen minutes to a half hour each day to stop everything and just be still with God. Don't DO anything, just claim some quiet time by yourself, with a friend(s) or with the kids, to sit, quiet your hearts, empty your minds of all outside things, just breathe, and be still. Pause, renew, refresh, reconnect. It's just my humble suggestion to you to give it a try for these forty days of Lent. Let us allow our dear Pastor Lynn to continue to be our spiritual leader and guide even during this sabbatical time. She had the wisdom, trust and humility to take the risk of being an example for us. She is showing us the holiness of sometimes withdrawing just a bit and "being" instead of always "doing"; to pause, renew, refresh and reconnect. Think about it. Pray about it. Make your own choice. Have a blessed Lenten season.
