## Wave of Prayer 5—June 25, 2022

The Summit of the Americas held its 9<sup>th</sup> meeting in Los Angeles from June 4 to 10. Because Cuba, Nicaragua, and Venezuela were not invited (in the name of fostering democracy), other nations (Mexico, El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras) refused to attend.

More than 250 mass shootings in the U.S. have killed more than 250 people and injured more than 1,000 already in 2022. On June 24, with bipartisan support, Congress passed the most significant gun control bill in 30 years. While gun safety group March for our Lives and many individuals welcome this bill, the National Rifle Association and many individuals oppose it. Our country is divided on this issue.

God, we pray for all those affected by mass shootings—those who've died, those who've been
injured, those who've carried out the shootings, and all the families involved. We pray for
grace and redemption, safety and security, and an end to mass shootings. We pray for the

Another issue which deeply divides our country is abortion. On June 24, the U.S. Supreme Court overturned the 1973 landmark decision, Roe v. Wade, which gave women the constitutional right to abortion. The overturning of Roe v. Wade will allow states to determine a woman's access to abortion.

 God, we pray for our country at this time of deep division. We know there are people on both sides of the abortion debate who are sincere in their faith and who seek to follow you. We pray for understanding, wisdom, love, and compassion as we think about the Supreme Court's decision and our own actions moving forward. Loving God, we offer you our prayer.
