*Come enjoy some fellowship, games, food and FUN!







Faith in Action

Lenten Offerings this year go to the Southeast Ohio Foodbank

This year, the Social Ministry Committee decided that the midweek service Lenten offerings will go to the Southeast Ohio Foodbank (https://hapcap.org/seo-foodbank/). As noted on their website, "In Southeast Ohio, 1 in 6 individuals, including 1 in 4 children, struggle with hunger. A combination of rising food prices, SNAP benefit cuts, wage stagnation and underemployment has contributed to an increased need in our emergency food services." This month, emergency SNAP benefits provided during the pandemic will no longer being be sent to our neighbors who have been dependent upon these funds to feed themselves and their families. Committee members involved with local food outreach programs have seen an increase in need in our County and the surrounding region, and this reduction will likely lead to increased need for food among our low-income neighbors.

Advocacy Regarding the Farm Bill

Every five years Congress passes a Farm Bill, the legislation for funding and programs regarding nutrition and agriculture in our country and internationally. We have the opportunity to tell our legislators our concerns about the Bill. Bread for the World through its annual Offering of Letters (www.bread.org/offering-letters/#resources) initiative has identified three areas of advocacy regarding the Farm Bill:

Nutrition – Malnutrition and undernutrition continue to be the leading cause of disease and death among the poor around the world, and this problem is predicted to increase in coming years without interventions to improve food distribution and production in impoverished areas around the world.

Equity - Bread for the World advocates for equity in the implementation of nutrition programs, that "every human being, created in the image of God, has inherent dignity and should have access to sufficient nutritious food."

Sustainability – Bread for the World and the Ohio Ecological Food and Farm Association (www.oeffa.org) are advocating for initiatives in the Farm Bill promoting preservation and regeneration of natural resources, along with reduction of food waste, so that ours and future generations will continue to be able to produce nutritious food efficiently.

Mount Zion Baptist Church Preservation Society has begun a major educational and service project with not only Athens City School District, but with other schools along the 330-mile route of the Underground RR from Athens to Buxton, Ontario. Working with the Ohio Council for the Social Studies, students will learn history but will also help MZ raise money to transform its 1909 building into a Black Cultural Center for the region. If you're not familiar with MZ, it is on the corner of Carpenter and N. Congress Streets. Note its beautiful rose window! An expert stained-glass company will be removing the windows in April to take to their studio for complete restoration. It is an expensive job, and they are hoping the community will provide support.
