2022-2023 CLC Highlights

- THE BRIDGE CAMPUS MINISTRY Chaired by Bonnie Childress. Students met weekly for food and fellowship forming deep connections. Students actively participated in the life of the congregation. "Barney" the big purple couch, started making appearances on campus to connect with more students.
- CLC LLC- Chaired by Rod Sauer. The apartments have been full rented for the 2023-2024 school year. Maintenance costs were low, things are running smoothly, and \$65,000 was generated for benevolences.
- LIFELONG FORMATION- Chaired by Chris Snoddy. Lifelong Formation Director, Lucy Crawford, was hired and developed and implemented Sunday programing for children and youth. Monthly intergenerational events have been offered to members and friends of the congregation that included; pumpkin carving, Christmas caroling, potlucks, chili cook-off, talent show, ice skating, amongst others. Two book Studies have been offered and led by Corrie Callaghan and ELCA's Declaration to People of African Descent series was led by Pastor Chad.
- LIFE TOGETHER AND OUTREACH-- Chaired by Dan Snoddy. Encouraged and supported our faith family by providing several opportunities for positive social interactions like the Giving Thanks Potluck, The Advent Smorgasbord, and most recently Pi-Day.
- **PROPERTY COMMITTEE-** Chaired by Marilyn Shealy. The property committee replaced the grease traps and flooring in the kitchen, installed one handicap accessible door to be used when the building is open and Rod Sauer has coordinated the AED training for Ushers and others who wished to attend.
- SOCIAL MINISTRY- Chaired by Doug Debrick. Publicized community actions and fund raisers for Good Works, Little Wings, Relief Works campaign for Ukraine, the Southeast Food Ohio Bank, Bread for the World, Serenity Grove, Montana de Luz, and many others. The committee supported God's Work Our Hands packing Snow Day Snack Bags, the CROP Walk, the monthly LSS Mobile Food Pantry and contributed food for Friday Night Life Supper with Good Works. The committee recommended to Council for the congregation to become an AMMPARO Welcoming Congregation and organized an effort to collect items for Backpacks for Good Works.
- EQUITY AND JUSTICE-Chaired by Doug Debrick. Assisted Pastor Chad with planning and implementing the 5 Sunday workshop series on the ELCA Declaration to People of African Descent in January and February. Members have directly and indirectly served in the Mt. Zion Baptist Church Preservation Society, in developing a cultural center for Black people in Athens, part of which will be to restore the stained glass window.
- IMPACT GIVING-Chaired by Chris Snoddy. Call for Proposals was sent in December of 2022 to over 100 non-profit and/or public organizations. Received 16 Letters of Intent in January 2023, totaling over \$200,000 in requests for funds. Committee recommended and Council approved 4 projects for funding; ACEnet, The Gathering Place, Serenity Grove, and Tri-County Career Center for \$52,603
