Notes from Social Committee

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Prevention Month

According to the National Child Traumatic Stress Network (NCTSN), there are "... more than 10 million abuse victims annually. 1 in 3 women and 1 in 4 men have been physically abused by an intimate partner, and 1 in 5 women and 1 in 7 men have been severely physically abused by an intimate partner." Moreover, Domestic Violence in the home "can have long-lasting negative effects on children's emotional well-being, and social and academic functioning." You can find many resources available online, and victims of Domestic Violence can call the Domestic Violence Hotline at 1-800-799-7233.

In Athens County, we have two resources, one being the Survivor Advocacy Outreach Program, which can be reached at 740-591-4266. Also, Christ Lutheran has supported My Sister's Place in many ways, including annual Benevolence funds, since the beginning of that program. My Sister's Place provides not only Emergency Shelter but also a 24/7 Hotline, Outreach Counseling, and Court Advocacy for victims. For a few years now they have also offered My Sister's Paws, so that victims do not have to leave their pets behind. For more information go to www.mspathens.org. The Civic Life and Faith Study will continue in October, with sessions being after the Sunday services on the 15th and 22nd.

Earth Justice Season of Creation Did you know that currently we are in the "Season of Creation," a world-wide ecumenical celebration of God's Creation? (www.seasonofcreation.org). It began in September and on Sunday, October 1st, we will celebrate the culmination of the season with a Creation-focused worship service in the morning. Then we will have a Blessing of the Animals at 1:00 in the Backyard to honor God's creation and also St. Francis of Assisi, who taught us our place in the family of all created things. His feast day is October 4.

Undies and Sweats

Again this fall, Social Ministry is organizing a fund raising campaign called "Undies and Sweats." In recognition that occasionally elementary school age students may need a change of underwear or a pair of sweatpants during the school day, we are asking friends and members of the congregation to donate money for the Undies and Sweats Fund. At the end of October, we will gather up the donations and send the money to Athens County Children Services and their School Outreach Program, which has workers in most of the elementary schools in the area. They can use the funds to buy items that are needed for their building. To donate, go to the Give button on the church's webpage and pick out this category for your contribution. 
Ministry Notes


