



#### MAY 2025 WAVE OF PRAYER

April 15 marked two years since the start of renewed violence in Sudan, after several decades of genocide by a dictator. Two warring parties who used to cooperate and commit genocide are now in a power struggle. With over 13 million internally displaced, it's the worst displacement crisis in the world. Massacres and sexual violence continue, even in refugee camps where displaced people are meant to have protection. Hunger and resulting death are rampant, while aid and funding is in short supply.

God, as we prayed a year ago and many times since, we lift up the Sudanese people who are suffering from past and present acts of horrific violence. Give aid and healing to those living in fear and in trauma. May there be a way to peace. Loving God, we offer you our prayer.

On March 28, a 7.7 magnitude earthquake hit Myanmar. Over 3,500 people lost their lives, and over 5,000 have been injured, with 200 still missing. Even before the quake, 20 million people (one third of the population) needed humanitarian assistance due to the conflict between the military junta and resistance groups. Now the need for aid is magnified though it is blocked in some areas and though fighting continues even amidst a ceasefire to allow aid to reach the people. As the UN humanitarian chief said, "It's a compounding crisis. It's earthquake on top of conflict on top of huge existing need."

God, we pray for the people of Myanmar who are trying to recover from their devastating losses, not only from last month's earthquake but also from the ongoing regional violence. May aid be accessible to those in need. May the fighting groups somehow resolve their conflicts. May the people of Myanmar experience peace. Loving God, we offer you our prayer.

In 2023, almost 40 million people were living with HIV. Over one million were newly infected that year, 44% of them women and girls. (In sub-Saharan Africa, women and girls account for 62% of new infections.) Over half a million people died from AIDS-related illnesses in 2023, and over 42 million people have died from the same since the start of the epidemic. About 77% of people living with HIV had access to treatment in 2023, which is up from 2010 but still short of the target. While new HIV infections and AIDS-related deaths have decreased, one person died every minute of AIDS in 2023.

God, we thank you for the progress which medical science has made in terms of treating HIV and AIDS-related illnesses. May this progress continue. We pray for each person living with HIV, that they may experience peace and hope. We thank you for those who have helped raise awareness about what HIV and AIDS is and isn't. Loving God, we offer you our prayer.

While so many people need assistance around the globe, the United States has suspended, ended, or decreased many of its aid programs. These funding cuts have seriously impacted the lives of countless people, most of whom are unknown to us. In Ethiopia, where I currently live, some Mennonite Central Committee partners have lost their funding, for example, for health care and medicines.

God, for all organizations who have experienced funding cuts, we pray that they may somehow continue to serve those in need. For all individuals who are not receiving the assistance they need, we pray for care and comfort. May we be reminded of the life of Jesus, whose resurrection we celebrated on Easter Sunday. Jesus reached out to those who were suffering. He helped those in need. Thank you for the many people today who are the hands and feet of Jesus in our suffering world. May each of us seek to be the same. Loving God, we offer you our prayer.
